

What to expect from an MRI enterography scan

The information listed below is only a guide; you will be advised of specific details when making your appointment.

MRI (Magnetic Resonance Imaging) produces detailed cross-sectional images of most parts of the body, using two naturally occurring forces to generate the images – magnetic fields and radio waves.

Please follow these steps before coming to your MRI appointment at Allevia Radiology:

Due to the strong magnetic field of the scanner, some patients may not be able to have an MRI examination. Please contact us directly if you have the following:

- · A cardiac pacemaker.
- Cochlear or Stapes implants.
- · Metal fragments in the eye.
- Metal clips on blood vessels in the brain.

Prior to your appointment

- Continue to take all prescribed medication as usual and bring a list of any medications you are currently taking to your appointment.
- If you are a diabetic, please bring with you any medications or food to be taken following your examination.

On arrival

- You should allow 90 minutes for this examination, including preparation.
- During the examination, contrast is administered intravenously to visualise the bowel. The staff will discuss this and ask for your consent prior to the scan
- 3. You will need to arrive 45 minutes before your scan time to drink 1 litre of liquid in preparation for your scan.

After procedure

- 1. After the scan, you can resume normal activities.
- 2. A report of your scan will be sent to your doctor as soon as possible.
